BREAKFAST

La Recova

A no-frills joint serving up freshly fried churros and delicious, thick chocolate. *Herrería del Rey, 3*

Antigua Casa de Guardia

Founded in 1840, this is Malaga's oldest wine bar! *Alameda Principal, 18*

GREAT SEAFOOD

Marisquería Casa Vicente

Go local at this traditional, rustic establishment where you'll find some of the city's best seafood! *Calle Comisario, 2*

La Campana

Smack dab in the historic center and famous for its fresh fish and seafood! *Calle Granada, 35*

El Tintero

A famous *chiringuito* where you flag down waiters when you see something delicious passing by! *Avenida Salvador Allende, 340*
